Admission Policy

1. All entries of exhibits must be made on the forms supplied by the Show. Entry forms can be found on our website at napanshow.com.
2. All entries, except those for the Hauling Match must be received by the Show Committee no later than Saturday, July 20, 2024. This includes 4H.
3. The entry form must contain a correct list of the animals and/or articles which it is intended to exhibit. In case of purebred stock, registry need not accompany the entry form, but must be presented to the checking committee upon request.
4. In all cases, the Napan Agricultural Show reserves unto itself the right to reject entirely or accept conditionally any item(s) and or animal(s) any exhibitor may intend to exhibit or show during the Show.
5. Under no circumstances will animals, which are suffering from contagious disease or articles which are offensive by reason of their odour or appearance, or which are dangerous by reason of the combustible or explosive character, be

admitted, and if any such exhibit be placed during the Show, it may be removed by the order of the Napan Agricultural Show.

6. The Napan Agricultural Show is an open show.
7. Before placing exhibits, exhibitors shall inquire to the Show Directors as to where each individual exhibit shall be placed, and at the close of the Show, shall immediately take charge of the same.
8. Exhibitors of animals and other exhibits liable to occasional accidents, injury or damage to persons coming in contact with them shall guard their exhibits, and protect the public from coming in contact there with and every such Exhibitor shall indemnify the Napan Agricultural Show from and against all claims and demands, costs, charges and expenses which it may incur, suffer or be put to by exhibit not being properly protected, or the public not being properly guarded there from.
9. While the Napan Agricultural Show takes every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of animals and other articles on exhibit, it must be distinctly understood the owners of all items exhibited are required to assume all the risks associated with placing their animal(s) or other items at the Show. Should an animal or other article be injured, lost or stolen during the Show, the Napan Agricultural Show will render all assistance in its power for the recovery of the same. However, in no circumstance will the Napan Agricultural Show recognize any claims for payment for any lost stolen or injured animal or article, or any portion thereof.
10. Exhibitors who wish to sell and/or deliver goods on the show grounds or property owned by the Napan Community Hall, must make prior special arrangement with the Napan Agricultural Show Committee.
11. The Napan Agricultural Show reserves the right to close any exhibit, order the ejection of any exhibitor should it be satisfied that the business carried on by the exhibitor is immoral, fraudulent, or otherwise objectionable, or in any way contravenes the rules set forth in the prize book.
12. By entering an animal or any article in the Napan Agricultural Show, the exhibitor agrees to be bound by all rules and regulations governing the entry and placement of such exhibits.
13. All decisions of the Judges and Executives are final.
14. All exhibits both livestock and non-livestock will be on a first come, first served basis.
15. Any substitutions before the closing entry date must be made to directors of the livestock section before Saturday, July 20, 2024.
16. All exhibits must remain in classes entered.
17. All livestock exhibitors must have liability insurance.
18. Exhibitors with cattle, swine, and sheep MUST have a PID number and be compliant with federal standards with regards to transporting animals.
19. It is strongly suggested that all livestock have their vaccinations.

Rules of Conduct

1. No alcoholic beverages on the show grounds.
2. No smoking in any buildings.
3. Any person who is found to be intoxicated or unruly will be removed from the show grounds.
4. Exhibitors' animals must be in the stall assigned to that exhibitor.
5. Exhibitors are required to maintain clean & tidy stalls. Failure to do so can result in forfeiture of trucking fees. Barn prizes will be awarded to an exhibitor in each barn who has the most "curb appeal".

6. Horses are to remain in their stalls at all times unless being groomed, washed, or participating in ring events.
7. For the safety of all individuals, there are no dogs allowed on the fair grounds.
8. Due to limited space, each exhibitor is entitled to one camp site only. Extra sites will be permitted if space is available. Camp sites will be assigned by the Director of Camping. Exhibitors are responsible for their camp site area.
9. Once an exhibitor's trailer is set up in the camp site area, all accompanying vehicles must be off the show grounds. These vehicles are permitted to park in the field adjacent to the camp site area.
10. Only vehicles accompanying travel trailers are permitted to park in the field adjacent to the camp site area.
11. Quiet time at camp site will start at 11 PM.
12. No horse play while in the barns or on the show grounds.
13. Any exhibitors in violation of any of these rules could be subject to forfeiture of their prize money.

Rules & Regulations

1. Copy of insurance card or fax copy must be sent in with entry form.
2. The competition is a four-day event. Horses must be on the show grounds by 4 PM, Thursday, August 8, 2024 and remain until 6pm on Sunday, August 11, 2024
3. The accepted 14 entries will be selected by a random draw. Additional entries maybe permitted pending space availability, at the discretion of the Light Horse Director. If additional entries are allowed, they will be selected by random draw.
4. This is an open competition; all competitors will compete against each other.
5. Competitors must be 10 years of age or older to enter.
6. Competitors ages 18 and under must wear a helmet.
7. Helmet or hat (with a tie down) must be worn. If you lose your hat, a 5 second penalty will be applied.
8. All competitors must be dressed appropriately for the class they enter. Western Exhibitors must wear a hat or helmet, long sleeved shirt, western type pants and boots.
9. No profane language will be tolerated.
10. Keep stall clean and tack hung up.
11. We require that all competitors clean up after themselves before leaving.
12. Due to limited space, no tack stalls are available.
13. If any competitor wishes to ride his or her horse between classes, they must do so in the assigned area only.
14. No substitution of horses will be permitted. Only the horse entered on the entry form will be allowed to compete.
15. Use of whips or bats in all classes are strictly prohibited.
16. A horse cannot be ridden by more than one rider in the same class.
17. All competitors must be ready at the gate for their turn. The competitor will have 30 seconds from the time their name is called to make their run.
18. Your horse will enter the ring through the gate at a walk. There is no running until the gate is closed.
19. Abuse of any horse, anywhere on the show grounds, will not be tolerated.
20. All horses must be tied by the head.
21. The Judge's decision is final.

Tough Farmer

About

The Tough Farmer Competition has been a crowd favourite for many years. Teams of two will compete against each other, completing various “farm related” tasks. Competitors are guaranteed to laugh, get dirty, and have fun!

Events Include:

Rubber Boot Kick- Each player is required to kick a boot off their foot. The team who can “kick their boots” the furthest, wins that round.

Hay Roll- Teammates work together to roll a round bale of hay to the end of the ring and back.

Blind Pony Express- One blindfolded player is led around an obstacle course by their teammate using only a rope and verbal cues “Gee & Hah”

Hit the Nail on the Head- One long nail will be placed in a piece of wood. Each teammate will take turns hitting the nail into the board. They only get one swing at a time, whether they hit the nail or not.

Wheelbarrow Race- Each team has to navigate a course while one teammate is in the wheelbarrow and the other pushes. Along the course they will be required to pick up items and add them to the wheelbarrow.
